Which residential hall do LLC students live in?

All Living Learning Communities will be housed in Coronna Hall in suite-style units. Spaces are limited in each community. If an applicant meets the LLC requirements, they will be accepted on first-come, first-serve basis based on the housing application date.

- Private/Single Rooms: The essence of being in a Living Learning Community is to live together. Therefore, there are no private/single rooms in the LLC's.
- Roommates: Students must live with a roommate in their own LLC. It can be a roommate of their choosing as long as both are in the same LLC.

Is there any additional cost to be in an LLC?

There will be a \$75 fee for participation in a Living Learning Community. This will defray the costs of programming for students. The \$75 is automatically added to the tuition bill.

How do I apply to become part of a community?

Participation in an LLC is an academic year commitment. Spaces are limited in each community. Students can apply for the 2019 living learning communities when applying for housing on ULink. Please refer to the Office of University Housing website for information on when the Fall 2019 housing application will go live.

Follow these steps to apply to a Living Learning Community:

T Get accepted to UL Lafayette.

• Once you receive an official acceptance letter from the Office of Admissions, you are ready to go!

2 Get your ULID. You will receive your ULID (student identification number) from Admissions when you are accepted

to UL Lafayette.

3 Make the decision to become part of an LLC. You are here reading this website so you are half way there! Apply for housing on Ulink, our student portal to access University online services. Select the LLC of your choice on the housing application. You will only see the LLC's you are eligible for on the application.

5 Carefully read the LLC Expectations in the housing application. The expectations document will be attached to your housing application. You can also read it here.

6 Sign the LLC contract that is inside the housing application. Remember that the LLC is an academic year commitment - both Fall and Spring semesters.

7 Receive an acceptance email with attached contract from the LLC Coordinator. The acceptance email will be sent to the student UL email address. Students can check email in ULINK.

8 Register for your classes at orientation. Remember that the LLC classes will be scheduled for you by our office and will appear on your schedule at Orientation.

Attend LLC orientation. All LLC students are required to attend LLC Orientation on Friday, August 23, 2019. Details will follow during the summer.

Note to parents . . .

Please allow your student to make their own decision to participate in a living learning community. If they are interested, please also allow them to choose which community to apply to. We have had some unhappy students because their parents wanted them to participate and also chose which community they would participate in.
