Emergency Notification System

The University's Emergency Notification System is designed to provide immediate alerts for emergencies and threats on campus. All students and employees **must opt in** to the Emergency Notification System to receive the messages.

A test message is sent in the spring and the fall to ensure the system is working properly.

The University has taken steps to enhance its ability to notify students, faculty, and staff in the event of a public emergency. We have learned that for our ENS to be effective, multiple overlapping technologies must be used. We also know that the success of this program requires everyone to do his or her part.

Your part is to understand this document, continue to be aware of your surroundings (See Something, Say Something), and contact University Police (911 or 482–6447) in the event of any emergency.

All students can register and update their ENS profile by logging into ULink.

General Information

- The ENS system is designed to provide immediate notification for emergencies on campus. Even though
 the University may utilize the ENS for all emergencies, it is not designed for incidents such as
 hurricanes, in which there are days to prepare.
- The University has the ability to send text messages with its ENS to any and all of the following technologies:
- Text messages
- o Cellular telephone calls
- o Campus landline telephone calls
- University website
- o University social media sites
- University hotline
- Initiation of the emergency notification system shall be implemented by University Police or other authorized persons.
- The University has an agreement with a 3rd party vendor to facilitate the implementation of any and all
 of these technologies.
- Students and employees may register up to three phone numbers and two email addresses with the
 University's ENS. Students are encouraged to include parents and loved ones in their ENS profile.
