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# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA AT LABARETTE and SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA UNIVERSITY

### Preamble

The Intercollegiate Ed.D. Consortium for a Doctorate of Education in Leadanship is an academic partnership between two institutions of higher learning officing a common core of academic coursework with shared seminars reflective of advanced study in education. The institutions are jointly authorized to offer the Doctorate of Education of Leadonship (Ed.D.) through this consortium. The collaborative effort supports open unical atom for student mobility and matriculation through the utilization and application of an agreed even philosophical base. Students will enroll in core and specialty courses across both component to ensure a significant educational experience from each institution. All courses completed within the consortium and considered resident between member institutions. The outcome game was an educational alliance that promotes teaching and research in an arrangement in which resources are shared and quality graduate coursework is actualized.

### Administration

An Ed.D. Consortium Committee will be established to attribute the Consortium to assure that the policies of the Consortium are reflective of the interest of the member institutions and responsive to the needs of the education profession. Membership on the Ed.D. Consortium Committee will consist of the chief academic officer, the dean of the Conduste School, the dean of the College of Education and the graduate program coordinates from each participating

institution.

The Ed.D. Consortium Committee will adopt by laws to grade its internal operations and will meet at least semi-annually at rotating sites of participating the indicas. Officers of the Consortium Committee will consist of a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and Servery. The Chair position will rotate between the chief academic officers of participating institutions every two years. When the Chairperson of the Ed.D. Consortium Committee is from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, the Vice Chairperson will be from Southerstern Louisiana University, and vice versa. The Secretary shall be the graduate program coordinates from the Chairperson's institution. The University of Louisiana at Lafayette will take for find for the first two years.

The Ed.D. Consortium Committee will be responsible for exhibiting and revising policies for the operation of the Consortium as necessary. Completed with all policies, rules, and regulations of the Consortium will be monitored by the Committee.

In discharging its duties, the Consortium Committee and appropriate. Membership on committees may consist of members of the governog Ed.D. Consortium Committee and others whose expertise will aid the operation of the Consortium. A committee of the faculty shall be established for appraising and revealing those aspects of the curriculum that are shared by the participating institutions. Each participating institution, using minimum criteria set by the Ed.D. Consortium Committee, shall have jurisdiction over its faculty and program.

Each institution will be responsible for maintaining a depository for all official documentation for the Consortium, including minutes of all committees meetings. Each institution will be responsible for maintaining all student-related documentation for students enrolled through that institution.

Each institution will appoint a graduate program countries of the an approved member of the graduate faculty. The graduate program coordinators using with the Ed.D. graduate faculty, will constitute an Ed.D. Coordinating Committee. The graduate program coordinators will serve as Co-Chairs of the Ed.D. Coordinating Committee. The Ed.D. Coordinating Committee will meet at least two times a year on a rooting bests and the Co-Chairs of the Coordinating Committee will report to the Ed.D. Consortium Committee during each Consortium Committee meeting.

# Resources

Monies generated by tuition and fees for each course offered to the program will accrue
to the institution at which a student is registered. Each institution will be responsible for
providing the instruction and research resources necessary to means that its contribution to the
Consortium is one of high quality. Collectively, the participating institutions will be responsible
for providing resources sufficient to assure receipt and maintenance of professional according to
the Ed.D. program.

### Faculty

Faculty members who teach in the program will be qualified a hold graduate faculty status at their home institution. Faculty contributions to the Ed.D. program will be evaluated according to existing policies in place at each institution.
