amended, or (2) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Without limitation of, and subject to, the foregoing, the objects and purposes for which this corporation is established are to carry on the following educational and charitable purposes or any of them, both directly and by application of assets to any other corporation, trust, fund or foundation whose purposes and operations are charitable or educational, as follows:

- (a) To advance and strengthen the tie of affection and esteem formed in school days, and by organized effort to further the interest and improvement of The University of Louisiana at Lafayette or its successors;
- (b) To fund scholarships and other means of encouraging education, and to that end to establish, maintain and administer funds for the assistance of worthy students of the University of Louisiana at Lafayette; and
- (c) In all and any ways to further the interests of the students and alumni of said school; and to organize local alumni chapters throughout Louisiana and elsewhere.

This corporation shall be a private corporation and not a public body, and shall not carry on any activities that would cause the corporation to be deemed a public body. The corporation shall neither participate in, nor intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE III

The corporation shall enjoy perpetual corporate existence unless sooner dissolved in accordance with law.
