Arch degree from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He was professor and assistant dean at the University of Arkansas for sixteen years serving under dean E. Faye Jones, FAIA. He maintained a vest pocket award-winning practice in Fayetteville, AR, and was associated with Mott Mobley McGowen & Griffin in Fort Smith. He is former president of AIA Northwest Arkansas; secretary and president of AIA South Louisiana; vice president of AIA Louisiana; has served on the board of directors of Downtown Lafayette Unlimited, on the board of directors of the Acadiana Symphony Orchestra, and the Board of Directors for the Friends of Louisiana Public Broadcasting. He was chairman of the Interior Design Professional Interest Area for several terms at National AIA. He is a retired Lt. Col. in the USAFR where he was a member of the USAF HQ Design Advisory Council for many years. He has chaired 7 Planning Assistant Teams, the Air Force equivalent to AIA R/UDAT studies. He was elevated to Fellowship in the American Institute of Architects in 1998.
