## **Governance Task Force Meeting Minutes | April 26, 2019**

## Notes:

- Dr. Savoie opened the meeting and each person introduced her/himself and department
- Defined Governance as providing voice, empowerment, and autonomy
- Discussed current structure which includes Faculty Senate, GSO, Student Government
- By the numbers (according to Paul Thomas)
  - Unclassified staff: ~600 (currently not represented)
  - Classified staff: ~350 (currently not represented)
  - o Faculty: ~639
    - Part-time faculty is currently one per college, so this group is underrepresented in faculty senate
- Different groups within larger categories:
  - o Faculty:
    - Tenured / non tenured
    - Professor Rank: Full / Assistant / Associate
    - Full-time / Adjunct
  - o Staff:
    - Classified / unclassified (includes faculty and professional staff)
- Committee structure and membership (mindful of diversity of membership in terms of these larger categories)
- Looking ahead:
  - o What would these bodies be charged with? Policy making? Review?
    - Must provide support and some decision-making authority or else they can't function
  - o Dr. McKinney and Dr. Hebert will research governance structures at peer institution
    - Not many in-state examples
    - University of Kansas example reviewed
    - SREB and SACSOC peer institutions
    - "staff council" (Dr. Hebert's previous institution)
  - o Transparency and Communication:
    - provide a central place for resources, minutes, agendas and decisions to be stored and easily accessed
    - University policy website, ULink, Faculty senate website
  - o Reconvene in fall; make decision and implement by end of fall
