G 1: Transfer Student Enrollment and Retention

The transfer coordinator plans to enhance prospective transfer student knowledge of the University through campus outreach at local community colleges. Campus visits and fairs along with updated and improved website information will showcase both admissions and evaluation of transcript processes.

Transfer students will be evaluated at the conclusion of the semester to determine if academic progress has been achieved. Students will be contacted to further clarify services for students, specifically academic support information.

Student Success: The transfer coordinator will track SLCC student enrollment to identify those students who are not making academic progress (2.0 semester GPA) at the University. Students who earned less than a 2.0 semester GPA will be contacted by the transfer coordinator and provided a *Resource Guide for Success*. The students will also be offered the opportunity to meet with the transfer coordinator to discuss individual barriers to success at UL.

Assessment included: Students that transferred to UL Lafayette from SLCC in the Fall 2012 semester.

Number of students assessed: SLCC transfer students who enrolled in Fall 2012 and earned less than a 2.0 semester GPA.

Source of Evidence: Benchmarking

Success if defined as: Increase first year student success by 3% compared to previous Fall cohort.

Finding (2015-2016) - Target: Met

In early Spring 2016, the Transfer Coordinator reached out to SLCC students that earned less than a 2.0 semester grade point average (53 students/27 percent of transfer population) the first semester of enrollment at the University. The outreach was designed to further explain services for students, specifically academic support information. This same outreach was provided to students under performing from Delgado Community College and Baton Rouge Community College. At the conclusion of the Spring 2016 semester, the GPA of the students contacted will be evaluated for improved academic performance. Research has indicated that it typically takes two semesters for transfer students to adjust and for the semester grade point average to recover.

O/O 2: Early College Academy

Early College Academy: Retain graduates of the Early College Academy at the same rate of the University first time freshman student population which is 74.5%.

M 2: Early College Academy

Early College Academy: Lafayette Parish School System and South Louisiana Community College have partnered together to create the LPSS-SLCC Early College Academy. Early College Academy (ECA) blends high school and college work, compressing the time it usually takes to complete a high school diploma and a college degree. Students complete the regular high school curriculum and also complete college courses. At the end of the four years, ECA students will have completed all requirements for achieving a high school diploma and an associate degree in General Studies. ECA is considered a school of choice and services student from Lafayette Parish. No specific high school GPA or ACT/SAT scores are required for admission, students must only score basic on the LEAP test. A basic score on the LEAP test indicates that a student demonstrates fundamental knowledge and skills needed for the next level of schooling.

Assessment included: Students graduating from ECA in 2014 and enrolling at UL.

Number of students assessed: All ECA students enrolled as full time students at UL.

Source of Evidence: Existing data

Target:

Success is defined as: Retaining graduates of the Early College Academy at the same rate of the University first time freshman student population (76.3%).

Finding (2015-2016) - Target: Met

In the Fall 2015 semester, 27 students enrolled at the University from the Early College Academy. 62% (17 students) earned a 2.0 gpa or higher in the Fall semester. In the Spring 2016,21 students returned (77%).
