Met	For the Fall 2015 semester, TLC had 6,451 visits. 2,733 of those visits were for individual appointments, 2,481 were SI related, 1,177 were for study groups, and 39 visits were for Math Lab (offered through the math department). In the Fall 2016 semester, TLC saw a decrease with 5,589 visits. The decrease can be attributed to two factors: 1) TLC no longer tracks Math Lab visits and 2) TutorTrac was not operable in the first few weeks of the semester and we were unable to track visits. In the Spring 2016 semester, TLC had a total of 4,430 visits. 2,217 of those were for individual appointments, 116 were for Math Lab, 1,350 were SI relatd, and 690 were for study		- Assessment Process: Continuous monitoring: TLC will continue to build it's presence on social media and on campus. Not met	Last assessment cycle, we saw a dramatic increase in the use of online tutoring via NetTutor. In FA15, there were 818 visits logged with a total of 292 hours spent with online tutoring. In SP16, there were 626 visits logged with a total of 234 hours spent with online tutoring. This assessment cycle saw a decrease in usage. This can be explained by the change in the process of making online tutoring available to students. In prior semesters, all eligible courses were manually added to the NetTutor metacourses on Moodle by a dedicated staff member. This new assessment cycle, beginning in the SP 17 semester, we depended on faculty to add their eligible courses to the NetTutor metacourses on Moodle. Faculty were contacted prior to the semester with an explanation and instructions on how to add their courses.		- Policy / Process / Procedural: Due to the lack of control that TLC and ASC has over the administration of NetTutor services, we will no longer include it as part of our department assessment.
