All objectives were attainable with the exception of post-secondary completion, which through our UBMS history is overly ambitious. The UBMS program has a successful plan of operation to implement its activities and to achieve nearly all of its objectives.

## 5) What has the unit learned from the current assessment cycle?

For the next grant writing competition the rate of postsecondary education completion will be lowered to about 35%. UBMS staff have realized that many students stop out to work due to dire financial issues, marriage/family planning, and/or switch institutions/majors more often than predicted.
