FY17 ASSESSMENT UPDATES: Interpersonal/intrapersonal competence Student Worker Experience Spring 2017 Focus Group Summary A focus group was conducted in the Spring of 2017 and consisted of 3 student workers assigned to the University of Louisiana at Lafayette SGA Child Development Center. The following summery highlights the data received from anecdotal notes and group produced lists. The focus group was used to assess Interpersonal/intrapersonal competencies gained while engaging with clients and staff. Students reported gaining knowledge of ethical responsibilities during employment and improving self-reflection skills in order to foster relationships with the children, families and staff at the center. Students were able to distinguish the differences between Ethical Responsibilities and Ethical Dilemmas that are unique to early childhood education. During the focus groups, 100% of the students echoed the National Association for the Education of Young Children's (NAEYC) six core values of ethical conduct: 1 Appreciate childhood as unique and valuable 2 Base work on knowledge of how children develop and learn 3 Appreciate and support the bond between child and family 4 Recognize that children are best understood and supported in the context of family, culture, community and society 5 Respect the dignity, worth and uniqueness of each individual 6 Respect diversity in children, families

In 2017 student workers assigned to the SGA Child Development Center were given a Pre-Test and later a Post-Test to assess understanding and the knowledge of health and safety protocol in early childhood group settings.
