Undergraduate & Graduate **Program Description** Degrees The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) is offered through an affiliation with the Intercollegiate **Undergraduate Minors** Consortium for a Master of Science in Nursing (ICMSN). The curriculum is designed to prepare advanced practice nurses (nurse practitioners) in Family Health or Psychiatric/Mental Health. In the event that enrollment in these courses must be limited, students will be selected by their academic ranking based upon their cumulative GPA in graduate nursing courses.

## **Degree Requirements**

To earn the Master of Science in Nursing with a concentration in Nursing Education, the student must adhere to the following degree plan requirements:

- earn a minimum of 40-43 credit hours: Nursing Education concentration
- satisfactorily complete a Focused Scholarly Project or Thesis
- earn no less than a "B" grade in all coursework
