

Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs—Academic Programs (AVPAA-AP) Dr. Fabrice Leroy is responsible for the development of high-quality and innovative academic programs by directing new program development, program assessment, strategic program review, articulation agreements, and by overseeing the University's course Catalog.
